Teacher Updates

Grade 7:

Doucet & Porteous (Social Studies A & B): Presentation of our explorers projects will occur on Tuesday and Wednesday. We are so excited to see the students demonstrating their learnings. Once done, we will begin to look at the colonization of Canada and the creation of settler society in North America.

Gammie (PE): Students start volleyball demonstrating outcomes in manipulative skills, functional fitness, communication and effort.
