Teacher Updates

Grade 7:

Baxter (Drama 7): Students will continue a read-through of the script and start developing their characters.

Doucet & Porteous (Social Studies A & B): We are still examining the conflict between the British and the French, which, coupled with the American Rebellion, led to the early start of Canada as a nation.

Gammie (PE): Students continue to develop their knowledge of basic wall climbing fundamentals.

Hatch (Science): Students have been reviewing section 3 notes and continuing work on their brochures.

Howard (Math): We are working through Percents, Decimals, and Fractions still with a focus on converting fractions to decimals and vice versa.

MacLachlan (ELA 7A): We will be working on a radio play project in ELA.

Porteous (ELA 7B): We are working on our writing and developing a deeper understanding of some of the English language rules, including punctuation and capitalization in particular. **Camacha (Shop 7B):** Students learn about gerodynamics, applications as they plan for the

Grade 8:

Baxter (ELA A & B): We will start reading *The Giver* (novel study) as a group. Please remind your child to read 20 minutes/day = 120 minutes/week and post their Reading Logs on Google Classroom. "Until I feared I would lose it, I never loved to read. One does not love breathing." – Harper Lee.

Gammie (PE): Students are designing and performing individual & peer warm-ups. **Hatch (Science):** Students have been reviewing section 3 notes and continuing work on their brochures.

Henning (Social): Next week, we are starting to look at the development of Scientific Thought within the Renaissance, political Philosophy during the Enlightenment and Religious reformation, all examining how Worldviews of a society change over time.

Howard (Math): We are nearing the end of our Operations on Fractions unit and will be practising skills and doing assessments this week.

Grade 9:

Baxter (ELA): We will start reading *The Outsiders* (novel study) as a group. Please remind your child to read 20 minutes/day = 120 minutes/week and post their Reading Logs on Google Classroom. "Until I feared I would lose it, I never loved to read. One does not love breathing." – Harper Lee.

Anderson (Science): Students have transitioned to online learning of Ionic Compounds. Lessons are teacher-directed, recorded and posted on Google Classroom. We plan to write a quiz next Tuesday, Dec. 8th [3.2 Ionic Compounds and 3.3 Molecular Compounds].

Porteous (Social Studies): Next week, we will be wrapping up our examination of Rights and the Justice System through our last exercise regarding the "Bee Movie."

Gamache (Shop 9A and B): We are starting the Automotives unit and focusing on testing and boosting a battery.

Grade 10:

Anderson (Science 10): Students have transitioned to online learning of (C 1.1) Microscope Technology. Lessons are teacher-directed, recorded and posted on Google Classroom. We plan to write a quiz next Wednesday, Dec. 9th (Microscope function, Improvements in Lens Technology and scientists most responsible for early discoveries in cellular research).

Doucet (Social 10): Students are working on two tasks. Due Friday, December 11, is the international organization assignment. Following this task, students will write the issue three-unit exam. We completed the lectures before moving to at-home learning.

Howard (PE 10): We will continue our Dance unit this week. Please join us live in our PE block or record your daily activity outcomes via Seasaw through Google Classroom.

MacLachlan (ELA 10): We are continuing our novel studies.

McNutt (Math 10C): Students will be completing the factoring of the polynomial unit this week and moving on to linear functions next week.

McNutt (Math 10-3/10-4): Students will continue to look at similar figures this week, and the application of many of our topics will conclude in a "Dream Room Project." Students will need time and materials to construct their dream room; please check with your child next week on what materials they require. The project is due upon the return to school on January 11.

Baxter (CALM): Students will continue to work on their Portfolios and assignments for the Career Choices unit.

Grade 11:

Anderson (Physics 20): Students have transitioned to online learning of Chapter 6.1, including Hooke's Law, kinetic energy and potential energy. Lessons are teacher-directed, recorded and posted on Google Classroom. We plan to write a Chapter 5 & 6 test early next week on Monday, Dec. 7th, with a Unit C exam to follow on Wednesday, Dec. 9th.

MacLachlan (ELA 20): We are continuing our novel studies.

McNutt (Math 20-1): Students complete the Rational Expressions and Equations Unit next week.

Grade 12:

Anderson (Biology 30): Students have transitioned to online learning of Chapter 20, "Molecular Genetics." Lessons are teacher-directed, recorded and posted on Google Classroom. We plan to write a Chapter 19 & 20 test early next week on Tuesday, Dec. 8th, with a Unit C exam to follow on Thursday, Dec. 10th.

MacLachlan (ELA 30): We are continuing our novel studies.

McNutt (Math 30-1): Students have begun the Trigonometry Unit, which will take approximately three weeks to complete.

Porteous (Social 30): We will be looking at North America's political systems next week. In particular, we will be focussing on the political system of Canada. This will include examining the three branches of the federal government, and each's responsibilities, and how we can work for change in our country.
