Our team is super excited to welcome the students back on Monday. If you missed the official announcement, the Alberta government announced all classes for K-12 would return to in-person classes on Monday, January 11. Those that borrowed Chromebooks for the at-home period, please return them on Monday with the Power/Chargers.

Final Exam week for Grade 10-12 classes are scheduled from January 22 to January 28. We have added the schedule to our school calendar. Grade 12s can write the Government scheduled Diploma Exam or the school scheduled in-class final exam. As has been the norm, Junior High classes will continue as usual. Individual teachers decide if and when a midterm exam is used.

With COVID19, we are tweaking our Semester two High School Timetable. So far, we know that Ms. Greven will be offering high school art, while Ms. Howard will be offering Math 31. Mr. Gammie will also be offering PE20/30. With Covid, we had to scale back options, and we have been slowly adding them back. The possibilities for semester two will also include shop options, foods, and a novel approach to Band. In Junior High, we are looking at ways to offer more Math support, particularly in grade 9.

With students' absence, our maintenance team built some new seating areas upstairs, installed some more lockers, and replaced all of the Gymnasium lights with new LED lights, to mention just a few of the projects. McNutt (Math): Jan 11 to 15th class time will be dedicated to students completing the Tin Man Project and the Survey Project.

Porteous (Social Studies): We have started the immigration unit. We will be looking at the policies that Canada has for immigration, the reasoning behind them, and critically reflecting on how immigration works to meet the needs of Canada and industries within it.

Grade 12:

Anderson (Biology 30): Students are working on their last lab activity "Kaibab Deer Study." Students are also reviewing this week Unit C "Cell Division, Genetics & Molecular Biology." We have scheduled our postponed Unit C Exam for next Tuesday, Jan. 12th. The Unit D Exam will happen the following week Tuesday, Jan. 19th.

MacLachlan (ELA 30): We have finished a film study, and will be working on a play next week. McNutt (Math 30-1): Students are completing Chapter 6 Permutations and Combinations over the next week. Ch. 6 Exam will be Wednesday, January 13. Postponed exams are as follows: Ch 8 & 9 Trigonometry, Monday, January 18 and Ch. 7 Analyzing Radical and Rational Functions, Wednesday, January 20th. Final Exam - Thursday, Jan. 28


