What a week!

- The first session of *Rock the Diploma* for Math starts today. As a reminder, the bus from Nanton will leave JTF at 3:45 pm on Friday, stopping in WCCHS 4:20. Saturday and Sunday the bus will leave JTF at 8:45 am and stop at WCCHS at 9:20 am. Friday the session will end at 9:30 pm, Saturday and Sunday sessions end at 4:00 pm. **Buses will leave promptly on the identified times.** All students registered are welcome to ride the bus even if they have not identified they needed transportation.
- On Tuesday, January 21 A.B. Daley will be hosting Paul Davis, a social media and networking expert who works towards educating children and parents on the topics of Social Media and Online Safety. It is not very often that we are able to secure such a high calibre speaker on such an important topic. Any parents from A.B. Daley or J.T. Foster or interested community members are invited to attend his presentation at 7 pm on Tuesday, January 21 at A.B. Daley. Bring a friend too! This will be a parent presentation only, no babysitting is provided. Please mark this in your calendars and join in an informative evening! Paul will also be presenting to students in two groups during the day on January 21st. Grade 4-6 and 7-9 students will receive age-appropriate information on Digital Citizenship and online safety. These are topics that are also addressed in our health programming for these age groups.
- School Council meeting is coming up on Wednesday, January 22nd (yes the date has changed), 5:30 pm in our Learning Commons, please consider this your invitation to attend! We will look at plans provided to us and the costs for an upgraded gym.
- Reminder that Senior High Semester One textbooks need to be returned to Pauline in our Learning Commons no later than the day of the exam for that subject.
- With the cold weather, we have been experiencing you might be interested in knowing more about the Inclement Weather procedures. Complete information is contained in <u>Administrative Procedure 542</u> on the LRSD website but here are a few excerpts;
 - The Superintendent has the authority to temporarily close schools in emergent situations where the health or safety of students and staff may

- be endangered. The primary consideration in the event of severe weather conditions shall be the health and safety of students. Due to the large geographical area covered by the Division, school closures and bus run cancellations will not always be made on a system-wide basis.
- In recognition of the vast weather and topography variance that exists within the Livingstone Range School Division No. 68, the driver of each bus is responsible for making the final decision on whether or not to operate on any day when student safety may be in jeopardy or decide not to stop at a particular pick-up site if they feel the weather/road conditions warrant such action.
- Any of the following factors, or combinations of them, shall serve as guidelines for considering the non-operation of buses: a) local temperatures, including wind chill, that are colder than -40C; b) severely reduced visibility (.2 km or less); c) a combination of weather and/or road conditions that make bus operations unsafe. d) Road closures by R.C.M.P, municipal or other local road officials.
- Schools will remain open as long as students are present and/or staff are able to get to the school. Staff are expected to make reasonable efforts to be in attendance at school during normal working hours. Should the weather improve or roads become passable, they are expected to put forth the same reasonable effort and journey to school. Staff are expected to have a learning plan in place for days when school is open but they may not be in attendance for part or all of the day due to weather or impassable roads.
- Parents are responsible for ensuring that their child(ren) is/are properly clothed for the weather conditions. Parents are expected to exercise good judgment and care when deciding whether or not to send their child(ren) to school when weather conditions are extreme.
