"Virtual" Summer courses and camps for high school students!

Wondering what's happening with 'traditional' summer 2020 programs offered at many postsecondary institutions? I was too! Here is what I have discovered so far...

<u>U of A</u> - The usual summer programming for high school students won't be available for 2020. However, the U of A is making available some interesting (and **FREE!**) science courses for students in grades 7 through 12. All 10 courses are offered in a completely online format, and there's everything from Dinos 101 to Mountains 101!. You can try as many as you would like at no cost to you.

<u>SAIT</u> - Has offered many fabulous summer opportunities for students at all grade levels in past summers. They are currently working on some online versions of their past programs. Keep watching their website for updates "coming soon"!

<u>UBC</u> - The traditionally offered "UBC Future Global Leaders" program won't be offered face to face this summer. However, UBC is developing some pre-university workshops starting in July that will be conducted exclusively online. We have been asked to subscribe to their newsletter, or simply check back on their website as programs are set in place.

McGill - McGill University is offering their Summer Academy programming virtually this July! The program runs July 13 - 24, 2020 and students are invited to choose **one** of three separate courses as follows: <u>The Global and Domestic Demand - An Economist's Journey, Pathways to Neuro and Health Sciences</u> and <u>International Law and Humanitarian Intervention</u>. The cost per student is \$995.00.
