Focus AreaScenario 1	Please briefly describe your school's approach
Physical Distancing, Hand hygiene/sanitation	 A thorough cleaning of school facilities completed prior to student re-entry. Students and staff are required to perform hand hygiene when entering and to exit the school and before entering the classroom. Hand sanitizing stations at all entry points students who are unable to use sanitizer must go to bathrooms to wash hands as they enter the building. Hand sanitizer containing at least 60% alcohol is recommended as there is evidence that supports effectiveness against COVID-19. Hand sanitizer can help reduce the risk of infection by, or the spread of microorganisms when hand washing is not possible. If parents have questions about their child using alcohol-based hand sanitizer they should contact their school administration to discuss potential alternatives. Hand sanitizing stations will be placed outside of each classroom. Students and staff will sanitize while entering and leaving each classroom. Proper hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette will be promoted. All students will be provided education on proper handwashing and mask-wearing techniques. Posters demonstrating hand hygiene placed prominently throughout the school. All shared soft furnishings to be removed and stored on our stage or in other storage areas. Staff furniture that is not shared can remain. All classrooms will place desks in rows front facing using maximum distance possible based on class size for each room. Classes will have a minimalist environment to maximize the space between desks. Tables in common areas (Den, and Learning Commons) will be labelled with seating maximums to ensure physical distancing. Where physical distancing is not possible, masks will be required for staff and students. Staff and students must also wear masks in all common areas and hallways. Masks in the class

theory;

- Choose to play instruments that are lower risk (e.g., percussion or string instruments).
- It is required that all teachers and staff in all school settings and students in grades 4-12 wear non-medical masks while in shared areas of school, outside the classroom, and on school buses where they may not be able to maintain the recommended physical distancing requirements.
- Non-medical masks are not required while students are seated in the classroom during instruction if following the physical distancing guidance above. If close contact between students, or students and teachers/staff is occurring as a result of classroom activities, non-medical masks should be used for the duration of this activity.
- Two reusable masks per student/staff will be provided by the Government of Alberta. Additional single-use masks will be available at schools if required.
- When non-medical face masks are used, hands should be cleaned before and after putting it on and taking it off. Avoid touching the mask once it is on. Masks should be changed after they become wet or soiled.
- After removing a reusable non-medical face mask that will be re-worn prior to washing, it should be placed into a clean, breathable bag or container (allows for evaporation) for storage. Consider using a bag that can be washed. All masks should have two distinct sides, one side that touches the face and one that faces outwards.
 - Do not reuse masks that are wet or soiled prior to laundering. A wet or soiled mask that requires laundering should be placed into a sealed bag or container where it is stored until it can be taken home and washed.
 - Disposable masks that are damaged or dirty should be discarded into a garbage bin that is lined with a plastic bag.
 - A very small number of individuals may not be able to wear masks due to sensory or health issues. Face shields are not considered to be equivalent to non-medical face masks. It is important to comply with other personal preventative practices such as frequent hand hygiene and physical distancing as much as possible.
- Exemptions to mask requirement for all teachers and staff in all school settings and students in grades 4-12 include:

Office	Please briefly describe your school's approach Maximum occupancy signs will be posted near the main office. Limit to 1-2 in the office at a time. All doors locked from 9-3. The school phone number is posted on doors for entry into the building during locked times. Visitors to the school will be limited, and any visitors entering the school will be required to wear a masksignage will be posted at the front door. A visitor log will be maintained to assist with contact tracing if needed. All adult visitors and visitors who are students in grades 4 to 12 must wear a mask. Stickers will be placed on the floor to remind students to line up with social distancing. Plexiglass shields will be considered if distancing can not be maintained.
Supervision	 Please briefly describe your school's approach Supervision at each entrance, arrival and departure Staff will supervise students they teach whenever possible. Supervision will be offered in an increased number of areas so that students can spread out during break time. Students will be eating in the classroom, the Den, and will have the option to eat outdoors or offsite.
Arrival/Drop Off	 Please briefly describe your school's approach Separate entrances have been created for JH and HS students Students are asked to arrive at school no earlier than 8:25 am and leave the school by no later than 3:55. (unless receiving extra help). Parents must complete at home screening daily with their child before sending their child to school or on the bus. COVID-19 ALBERTA HEALTH DAILY CHECKLIST If a student is displaying COVID symptoms, they will be immediately isolated,

	 and parents will be contacted to pick up their child. An ad-hock isolation area will be used for these students and a signposted not to enter unless wearing PPE. Parents and children/students should not be in the pick-up area or enter the bus if they have symptoms of COVID-19.
Dismissal/Pick-Up	Please briefly describe your school's approach Students are asked to sanitize when entering/exiting the building. Before leaving home, staff, children/students, visitors, and volunteers who will access the school for work or education, must self-screen for symptoms each day that they enter the school using the Alberta Health Daily Checklist. Schools must keep records of children's known pre-existing conditions. If a child develops symptoms that could be caused by either COVID-19 or by a known pre-existing condition (e.g., allergies), the child should be tested for COVID-19 to confirm that it is not the source of their symptoms before entering or returning to school. Anyone that reports symptoms should be directed to stay home, seek health care advice as appropriate (e.g., call Health Link 811, or their primary health care practitioner, or 911 for emergency response), and fill out the AHS Online Self-Assessment tool to determine if they should be tested. Students who are walking or driving home are asked to leave the school grounds immediately after their classes. Students will be encouraged to stay in classrooms for lunch or to go outside. There will be limited access to microwaves. Microwaves will require sanitizing between users and facilitated by a staff member.
