 We're finishing up with Lord of the Flies, and will be working on some reading comprehension before moving on to the next text in our thematic unit.

ELA 30

 We've just finished up with Hamlet and students are beginning their first critical essay.

Math 9 Mrs. McNutt Students have begun their surface area topic. Students are asked to bring in a collection of right rectangular prisms, right triangular prisms, cylinders, cones, and spheres for their Tin Man Project. Math 30-1 Students are learning about Polynomial Functions and Relations. Students will learn how to identify and graph the various characteristics related to polynomials. There will be two guizzes prior to our week off with the chapter exam the week following the break. Math 30-2 Students are studying Exponential and Logarithmic Functions and Applications. They will wrap up this unit prior to the week off and will begin the next topic after the break. Mr. Porteous Social 7 - we will be examining the creation of the first French Colony (that continued) in Quebec. Social 8 - we will begin to examine how art exploded and changed significantly during the Rennaissance Social 9 - we are continuing our look at the justice system and Charter by focussing on the Youth Criminal Justice Act ELA 8 - we will be wrapping up our look at short stories and suspense before returning to our novel study of Walking in Two Worlds.
