<b>Scholarship</b>	<b>Description</b>	<b>Award Provided</b>
<a href="#">Dorothy Burton Memorial Bursary</a>	Nanton Drugs sponsors this annual award in memory of Dorothy Burton, a longtime and much loved employee at the store. Candidates should be registered to attend a post-secondary program, ideally in a science related discipline. Students must also submit a separate application and short essay to be considered for this award. Please see the office for the additional application form.	\$500
Princess Diana Humanitarian Award	The J.T. Foster Grad account funds a donation to the recipients' charity of choice. The award will be given to a student who demonstrates compassion for others and a charitable nature.	\$100
Western Communities Foundation "Western Inspiration Award"	Sponsored by Western Financial Group, this award recognizes a student who has overcome adversity (mental or physical) and financial hardship while demonstrating an outstanding community or school spirit... <i>"heroism or leadership in a crisis"</i> . Students who do not plan to attend post-secondary remain eligible for selection.	\$750
Nanton Booster's Citizenship Bursary	These scholarships, sponsored by the Nanton Boosters Club, are awarded to <b>two students</b> who have demonstrated good citizenship and leadership in school or community and who have maintained an academic standing to meet their goals.	\$750
Harry Dwelle Memorial Awards	These scholarships, sponsored by the Nanton Boosters Club, are awarded to <b>two students</b> who are well rounded, compassionate, respectful, hardworking individuals who demonstrate a positive attitude and will be pursuing an education in a trade or a technical program.	\$750
R. D. McDonald Bursary	These scholarships, sponsored by the Nanton Boosters Club, recognize <b>two students</b> who are interested in agricultural education programs. A students' agricultural background, Green Certificate program completion and work experience in agriculture, will be taken into consideration.	\$750

Best Performing Musician	Sponsor: Sue Moore. This award is given to the best performance musician as selected by the JTF music teacher.	\$200
Overall Musician Award	Sponsor: Bridget Jones. This award is given to the best overall musician as selected by the JTF music teacher.	\$200
Dusty Crick Memorial Award	Sponsor: The Friends of Dusty Crick. This award is given in memory of Dusty Crick who was a grade 12 student at JTF at the time of his death in January, 1978. The award is to be used by the recipient to further a hobby, talent, educational program or career path. The recipient must possess the ability to get along with everyone, be helpful in planning events and demonstrate good manners, just as Dusty would have done. The award recipient is to be selected by their grade 12 peers.	\$200
Governor General Academic Award	This award is given to the student with the top academic mark obtained in the school. Since Alberta diploma exam results are taken into account, this award is not provided to a recipient until July/August when diploma marks are available.	
Valedictorian Award	This award, sponsored by the Nanton Lions Club, is presented to our student once proof of post-secondary enrollment has been received. NOTE: An additional \$500 bursary may be provided, once the Valedictorian has completed paperwork required by the Nanton Lions Club.	\$1,500
Dr. Lloyd Cavers Scholarship	This scholarship is provided to one LRSD grade 12 graduate who is nominated by their school in recognition of their leadership and community activities. All nominees who are not selected for the award will receive \$400 in recognition of the students' distinct contributions). The successful candidate for this award will receive \$1,000.	\$200
Livingstone Macleod Association Bursary	LRSD grade 12 graduates who are pursuing a career in the trades at Olds College, SAIT or NAIT (if the program is unavailable at SAIT). Applications are due: May 10.	\$2,000
ENMAX Environmental Leadership Scholarship	LRSD grade 12 graduates with a 65% average who are pursuing environmental studies are eligible for this award. Applications are due: May 10.	\$1,000
<a href="#">LRSD Grade 12 Academic Award</a>	The grade 12 student in each high school within the Livingstone Range School Division who has the highest average and is registered in a post-secondary institution will receive this award. Calculations are based on the student's final school mark in the five highest subjects from the following group: Biology 30, English 30-1, Math 30-1, English 30-2, Math 30-2, Physics 30, Social Studies 30-1, Chemistry 30, Social Studies 30-2, Science 30, Mathematics 31. The Grade 12 Academic Award may be deferred for one year if the receiving student has not registered in a post-secondary institution. <a href="#">LRSD Grade 12 Career and Technology Award</a>	This award is provided to the grade 12 student in each LRSD high school who has met the requirements of a high school diploma, completed a majority of their CTS courses in a particular strand/cluster and is registered to attend a post-secondary institution. Applicants must have demonstrated academic progress and have shown the desire to advance into their selected trade throughout highschool. The Grade 12 Career & Technology Award may be deferred for one year if the receiving student has not yet registered in a post-secondary institution. <a href="#">NCBA (Nanton Community Broadcasting Association)</a>	This award will be provided to up to TWO grade 12 graduating students from JTF who is pursuing an education in Broadcasting/Communications. Student must complete an application and provide proof of registration at their post-secondary institution. Applications are open from January 1 to February 28 each year.	\$500 (2 available)
<a href="#">Margaret Foster Scholarship</a>	The Margaret Foster Scholarship is proudly administered by the Clifford and Louise Loughheed Scholarship Foundation and will be awarded to one deserving JTF grade 12 student. The student must plan to attend a post-secondary education program within 18 months of receiving the scholarship. Preference may be given to an applicant pursuing a career in the field of education. Applications are due: April 30.	\$1,000
<a href="#">Greg Dawson Memorial Scholarship</a>	This award requires an application form to be completed and mailed to the Greg Dawson Committee. The award is presented in memory of Greg Dawson who was a student at JTF and was tragically killed in a motor vehicle accident in 2001. Applications are due: April 30.	\$2,000
<a href="#">Bus Drivers Association Post-secondary Bursary</a>	This bursary is awarded to a rural student eligible to utilize school bus transportation during their grade 12 year. Students must be planning to attend a post-secondary institution after graduation. Students planning to take a gap year prior to attending post-secondary are still eligible. Completion of a short paragraph (200 - 500 words) including the applicant's name, their school and bus driver's name, the number of years they rode the bus and their plans for post-secondary education (i.e. college, polytechnic, university, apprenticeship trades) is required. Application is due: May 1.	\$150
<a href="#">Parent's Association Casino Bursary</a>	This scholarship will be awarded to one grade 12 student and EVERY student is eligible for this bursary. The academic standing for the student is not necessarily the main factor in receiving the award. However, the student MUST be planning to attend a post-secondary institution within 18 months of receiving the bursary. Application is due: May 15.	\$1,000

<a href="#">The Lynne Maynard Volunteer Award</a>	The Nanton Literacy and Learning Society offers a \$500 award (\$400 provided to the student, plus \$100 to be donated in the recipient's name to a Nanton and area charity of their choice) to a graduating grade 12 student in the Nanton area. Lynne Maynard was a tireless volunteer in the Nanton community and this award recognizes a young individual who demonstrates some of the qualities that Lynne exemplified. To be considered for this award, an applicant must be a student in the Nanton school geographic area, be graduating from grade 12 in the current school year (enrollment at a post-secondary institution is NOT a requirement) and have volunteer experiences in the town of Nanton and/or area. <a href="#">Glen Keeley Memorial Scholarship</a>	Applicants for this scholarship must be a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident, a resident of Alberta, and have attended school in Claresholm, Stavely, Granum, Nanton, Fort MacLeod or Pincher Creek for at least one year. The student must have achieved good academic standing in their grade 12 year or previous year of post-secondary education as well as having demonstrated outstanding qualities in the areas of leadership, community spirit and involvement in extracurricular activities. Applications are due: August 1.	\$2,000

<a href="#">Nanton and District Lions, Cliff Hooker Scholarship</a>	This scholarship is open to any Nanton area student starting their first or subsequent year of studies in a trade. Eligibility for the award is dependent on academic standing sufficient to achieve their stated goal, good citizenship demonstrated through community/social participation and volunteer work. Students must plan to attend a trade school within 18 months of receiving the scholarship and provide proof of enrollment prior to disbursement of the fund. Applications are due: September 15.	\$1,500
<a href="#">Clifford and Louise Loughheed Scholarship</a>	These scholarships are open to any Nanton area student starting first or subsequent years of studies. Eligibility for the awards is dependent upon: academic standing sufficient to achieve their stated goals, good citizenship demonstrated through community/social participation and volunteer work. Financial need will be taken into consideration. Preference may be given to applicants starting their second or subsequent years of study. Students must plan to attend a post-secondary or trade school within 18 months of receiving the bursary and provide proof of enrollment prior to the disbursement of funds. Applications are due: September 30.	\$2,000
<a href="#">Stavely Education Foundation Scholarships</a>	To be eligible, students must have attended Stavely School for a minimum of four years. The candidate will submit a paragraph sharing a favourite memory of Stavely School. The applicant will also ensure that an official confirmation of enrollment/registration from a recognized post secondary institution dated no earlier than September 30th of the scholarship year is submitted to the Stavely Education Foundation along with the completed application and required paragraph before the scholarship deadline. Any programs that begin after September 30th of the scholarship year may be considered. Preference is given to first time applicants. Qualified applicants may apply more than one year to be granted the maximum \$2000 ( \$1000 per year for two award years). Applications are due: October 31.	\$2,000
<a href="#">Florence A. Wilford Scholarship</a>	This annual scholarship has been established for a 'well rounded' student who completed a minimum of SIX YEARS at Stavely School and who is pursuing post-secondary education at a recognized university, college, polytechnic or apprenticeship training program. The award recipient is chosen based on leadership, community service and academic standing in both high school and post-secondary studies. Candidates must have completed at least one semester or term at a post-secondary institution to be eligible. Applications are due: October 31.	\$1,000 (may vary)
