Dual Credit Opportunities

In high school, students may occasionally face scheduling conflicts or gaps in their timetables. While this is a common challenge, there are alternative programming options available. Through partnerships with Olds College and Lethbridge College, students have the opportunity to enroll in online courses that count toward high school graduation and can be transferred to future post-secondary programs. Students with spare periods in their schedules may be eligible to take advantage of these courses—saving money and earning post-secondary credits at the same time.
